The 20th Biennial Conference held at New Mexico State University, Las Cruces NM October 11-13, 2018, was sponsored by the NMSU Anthropology Department and the Anthropology Graduate Student Organization, and was chaired by Dr. Lonnie C. Ludeman with help from Dr.Fumi Arakawa and Dr. William Walker.
